Proud to be a Wiltshire Freemason....



iltshire Freemasons have featured in newspaper articles, on BBC Wiltshire Radio, and in the online version of Freemasonry Today; and while individual members may well have been slightly embarrassed at having their names and pictures published, I am very proud of their achievements. For Paul Moffatt the Charity Steward of Gooch Lodge No.1295, and John Deane the Secretary of Corsham Lodge No. 6616 the prospect of being interviewed on BBC Wiltshire Radio must have seemed daunting, and yet with a little coaching from the Province's Communication Team, they really did excel in explaining how Wiltshire Freemasons are 'Making A Difference' during the current Covid -19 crisis.

One thing I am sure of, is that Paul and John would be the first to acknowledge the incredible assistance they have received from members of their Lodge.

I am also aware that Brethren from Lansdowne Lodge of Unity No.626, Vale of Avon Lodge No.8432, St Aldhelm Lodge No.2888 and Lodge of Concord No.632 have been very active in distributing face visors (PPE) and morale boosting 'goodies' to Care Homes and surgeries in and around the Province. Freemasons in Wiltshire have delivered over 4,500 pieces of Wiltshire made PPE in the past twelve weeks. I extend my thanks to each and every member for their incredible commitment. In the newsletter which was published at the beginning of the month, Simon Leighfield APrGM quoted the words of the Pro Grand Master, who said "What comes over loud and clear is that our Brethren are doing all this work because they **WANT** to do it." I can think of no better reason.

The Government has relaxed some of the restrictions imposed at the start of the Covid-19 crisis; unfortunately they are not sufficient to allow Grand Lodge to lift the suspension of Masonic activity. I am aware that when the Government makes a decision to permit larger gatherings of non related individuals, Grand Lodge will issue further advice on when and how we can meet. I know that many of you wish an end to this situation; but I also know that you would not wish any decision to compromise your safety and that of your family and friends. The watchword remains 'Be Patient'.

I am also aware that many of you will be wondering whether or not the annual meeting of Provincial Grand Lodge will take place in October; regrettably I can now confirm that due to the uncertainty of the situation we have had to take the decision to cancel this meeting (see notice on page4). However, I can confirm that the Communication Team is working on a plan to hold a special ZOOM meeting to which all active Provincial Officers, and those Brethren receiving a Provincial Promotion or a first appointment will be invited. Watch this space for further details.




